


Stage 2 Camp fees are now on the Sentral Parent Portal. Full or Part payments can be made at any time either in person, or through the app.

Classroom Award System -HOW2Learn

Throughout the year, students are be introduced to the dispositions of: Reflectiveness. Reciprocity, Self-regulation, Responsibility and Resourcefulness. Each of these dispositions have habits that support the development and understandings of the dispositions. Each fortnight students will study a different habit and our award system will reward those students that are displaying these habits. Students will be presented with an award in class that they will paste into their own award sheet. When a student fills their page with ten awards, they will be recognised at our whole school assembly by being presented with a HOW2Learn Merit Certificate by the school principal.



National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy 2024

In 2025 the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be held for all students in Years 3 & 5 in all government and non-government schools. This program will assess the literacy and numeracy learning of students in Australian schools. The tests will occur between 12th-21st March.



The results of the tests will provide valuable information to schools about what each student can do. This will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the agreed national benchmarks of student achievement. The tests will include a: Language Convention test (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) and a separate Writing test, Reading test and a Numeracy test (Number, Algebra, function and pattern; Chance and data; Measurement and space). Access to special provisions and exemption from the tests must be discussed with me, and a parent or carer consent form must be signed. Parents also have the right to withdraw their child from the tests. If you wish to withdraw your child from the tests you must sign a parent or carer consent form. Consent forms are available here at school.

Please make an appointment to see me if you would like further information about your child's participation in the National Assessment Program.

Beat the Heat

Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world. Remind your child to protect themselves from sun and heat exposure while at school by:

- reducing their exposure to the sun, wherever possible wearing broad-brimmed hats in the playground to protect the face, neck and ears.
- playing in shaded areas, particularly during peak times of UV levels
- drinking plenty of water using 30+ broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen.

Visitor Check in procedures

The NSW Gov and NSW Dept of Ed now require all visitors to check in daily using the new QR code that is in the front office. It is for contact tracing and WWCC purposes. If you don't have a Services NSW app on your smart phone you will be required to sign in using the iPad in the foyer that has been set up specifically for this purpose. Parents who attending an event such as a parent meeting or Canteen are required to check in. Parents **are not required** to check in for the purposes of dropping off or picking up their children or buying uniforms.

Speed limits in school zones

School zones are installed to reduce traffic speed near schools during the times indicated in the school zone sign. School zones are identified by signs which are displayed on both approaches to the school and show the speed limit and the times during which it applies. School zones are generally permitted on roads adjacent to schools where there is significant school related activity on and beside the road.

Speed limits which apply include: 40km/h on roads where the existing limit is 50km/h.
